

# Fishing Report 11th October 2021

This week's rod average is 5.67.

The good weather this week has certainly helped to bring on the early October fishing conditions. It's great to see lots of fish being caught and some of our anglers have had 20 plus fish to the boat with many others being lost along the way. Intermediate lines on a fast retrieve have been working well, others have chosen a washing line of flies and some have even had success on dries. The middle and far bank around the mouth of Fishtail Creek have shown good results. The hothead damsel and other fly patterns including a flash of orange have been popular this week.

We play host to the International Imperial Trophy competition this coming Wednesday, and so we do not have any boats available for Tuesday and Wednesday.

Please note - we are already fully booked this Tuesday 12th & Wednesday 13th October.

## Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **5.67** with 295 fish caught by 52 anglers.

## **Best Rainbow**

The heaviest Rainbow was 4lb 14oz caught by Steve Atkinson. The heaviest Brown was 4lb 2oz caught by Phil Harding.

#### **Methods & Flies**

Fish have been caught using intermediate and fast glass lines, with a washing line technique proving popular. Drifting and using a fast retrieve has again been the prevalent method this week.

The most successful flies have been black and green lures, buzzers, daddies, pink or white snakes, minkies, boobies, hothead damsels, bibios and blobs.

#### Top Spot

The most popular spots have been out in the main bay, Sitch Plantation, Fishtail Creek and Buoys 4 and 5.



# **Wheelyboat Fund Raising Project for Carsington Water Fishery**

Tony Higton, who supports our fishery with many aspects including our popular open competitions, is working closely with the Wheelyboat Trust to raise funds for a 3rd wheelyboat. Over the past year we have seen an increased need for more access boats of this kind. We have many anglers who use this due to a disability, ill health, or temporary conditions whilst recovering from treatment or an operation.

Tony's aim is to raise just over £13,000 for a new coulam wheelyboat, including push start engine and seats. Tony has already been busy looking at grant applications from all around the local area with donations already being pledged via the Ashbourne Freemasons. The Wheelyboat trust are the principal fundraiser and they have kindly set up a CAF fund raising page to help increase the funding level and meet Tony's target.
