Fishing Report 13th September 2021

The rod average is 2.41 for this week.

The week was challenging and the rod average has dropped a little.

Monday started off very promising with lots of fish caught, Tuesday and Wednesday were both hot, bright, still days which pushed the fish back down deep and produced some hard fishing conditions. Luckily the cooler winds from Friday onwards helped massively and fish were beginning to be caught on intermediate lines much higher in the water.

We also had a stocking from River Gwash Trout Farm on Tuesday, the first of our late summer / Autumn deliveries.

The main basin, dam wall and Fishtail Creek have been popular spots. Snakes, minkies, cormorants, daddies and hoppers have been the order of the week using intermediate / Di5 lines around 3 - 5 feet down.

We are already fully booked for Thursday 16th Sept this week. Please remember to pre book your boat to avoid disappointment.

We're still taking bookings for our Autumn Open competition which this year will be held on Saturday 2nd October, please do get your booking made if you're hoping to join us for our twice-yearly known pairs competition. Bookings to be made via our website.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **2.41** with 140 fish caught by 58 anglers.

Best Rainbow

The heaviest Rainbow was 5lb 2oz caught by Phil Harding.

The heaviest Brown was 3lb 9oz caught by Phil Harding.

Methods & Flies

Fish have been caught using mostly intermediate or floating lines. Anglers have reported success using Di5 lines, and stripping lures through.

The most successful flies were minkies, boobies, hoppers, daddies, black wulffs, snakes, cormorants and white or green lures.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been out in the main basin, Fishtail Creek, along the Dam Wall, and around Buoys 3, 4, 10 and 11.



Wheelyboat Fund Raising Project for Carsington Water Fishery

Tony Higton, who supports our fishery with many aspects including our popular open competitions, is working closely with the Wheelyboat Trust to raise funds for a 3rd wheelyboat. Over the past year we have seen an increased need for more access boats of this kind. We have many anglers who use this due to a disability, ill health, or temporary conditions whilst recovering from treatment or an operation.

Tony's aim is to raise just over £13,000 for a new coulam wheelyboat, including push start engine and seats. Tony has already been busy looking at grant applications from all around the local area with donations already being pledged via the Ashbourne Freemasons. The Wheelyboat trust are the principal fundraiser and they have kindly set up a CAF fund raising page to help increase the funding level and meet Tony's target.
