

Fishing Report 17th May 2021

What a difference a week makes! Rod Average 4.18.

The more settled, warmer weather towards the end of last week has certainly helped to bring the rod average up, doubling that of the previous week. Let's hope this is a sign of things to come and the fish do become more responsive to your fishing techniques.

We have experienced a different start to our season than those previous; there was a delay in opening, prolonged cold weather and frosty starts plus water levels higher than we have ever experienced for this time in the season. The high water levels have certainly changed the fishing areas, proving Millfields to come back on the top spots list whereas the bays at the North End have become washed out and less popular.

Despite all of this our stocking programme continues and has not been altered from previous seasons. Many of our regular anglers who fished over the past 4 days caught many fish with one exceeding 26 to the boat. There have also been many browns caught, some which have started to show from our stocking some 4 weeks ago.

We have still seen a mix of techniques being used from floating lines with buzzers to intermediate lines using hot head damsels, blobs and yellow lures. Stones Island and Sailing point have proven popular over the last few days.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was 4.18 with 159 fish caught by 38 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest Rainbow was 4lb 2oz caught by Mr Harding.

The heaviest Brown was 4lb caught by Mr Wood.

Methods & Flies

Fish have been caught using sinking, intermediate and floating lines. A number of anglers have caught using Di3 line.

The most successful flies were buzzers, hot head damsels, blobs, black snakes and yellow & green lures.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been the Sailing Club Island and Stones Island, Tower Bank, Fishtail Creek and Buoy 5.

Wheelyboat Fund Raising Project for Carsington Water Fishery

Tony Higton, who supports our fishery with many aspects including our popular open competitions, is working closely with the Wheelyboat Trust to raise funds for a 3rd wheelyboat. Over the past year we have seen an increased need for more access boats of this kind. We have many anglers who use this due to a disability, ill health, or temporary conditions whilst recovering from treatment or an operation.

Tony's aim is to raise just over £13,000 for a new coulam wheelyboat, including push start engine and seats. Tony has already been busy looking at grant applications from all around the local area with donations already being pledged via the Ashbourne Freemasons. The Wheelyboat trust are the principal fundraiser and they have kindly set up a CAF fund raising page to help increase the funding level and meet Tony's target.
