

Fishing Report 1st November 2021

Our rod average is still holding at 3.63.

The start of the week produced great results for many anglers with one boat landing 17 fish in total on Tuesday. Strong southerly winds came in during the second half of the week and made for more challenging conditions therefore most fish were being caught around the dam wall area and Fishtail Creek.

Most anglers have found success with intermediate or sinking lines using a fast retrieve method at a depth of ten foot and below, using snakes, boobies and weighted nymphs.

The clocks have now changed making the mornings much lighter and far easier for boat set up, however this has affected the later part of the day therefore fishing will be 8.30am - 4.30pm for the remaining week of the season.

Last Day of Fishing - Sunday 7th November 2021

Please ensure that you book online or call to book a boat so we know how many boats we require for the remaining days of the season.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **3.63** with 138 fish caught by 38 anglers.

Best Rainbow

The heaviest Rainbow were 3lb 8oz caught by both Isaac Fallows and Mr Bethell.

Methods & Flies

Fish have been caught using intermediate and sinking lines, with Di5 lines receiving many mentions on the catch returns.

The most successful flies have been black or pink snakes, minkies, black boobies, vivas, lead head nymphs and orange lures.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been the North End, from Fishtail Creek down the south-east shore to the Dam Wall and buoys 7 and 8.

Wheelyboat Fund Raising Project for Carsington Water Fishery

Tony Higton, who supports our fishery with many aspects including our popular open competitions, is working closely with the Wheelyboat Trust to raise funds for a 3rd wheelyboat. Over the past year we have seen an increased need for more access boats of this kind. We have many anglers who use this due to a disability, ill health, or temporary conditions whilst recovering from treatment or an operation.

Tony's aim is to raise just over £13,000 for a new coulam wheelyboat, including push start engine and seats. Tony has already been busy looking at grant applications from all around the local area with donations already being pledged via the Ashbourne Freemasons. The Wheelyboat trust are the principal fundraiser and they have kindly set up a CAF fund raising page to help increase the funding level and meet Tony's target.
