

Fishing Report 20th June 2022

The week started off cool and windy before temperatures soared upto the early 30's by Friday, dropping rapidly again over the weekend. The fish that had been seen in the upper margins were pushed back down into the depths by the scorching sun, changing success fishing methods across the week.

The rod average has risen again to 2.62, with more comments being received of strong fish who are up for a good fight. There has been a recent hatch of pin fry and the fish can be seen to be feeding heavily on them, bringing more of a challenge to the anglers. Towards the end of the week however, the fish had moved back down to lower waters and anglers were reporting success fishing slow and deep.

Roger Gill (pictured) joined us on Tuesday and had a great day out on the water, catching eight rainbows, the heaviest of which was 3lb 12oz. He tells us that fishing out in the main basin using ginger and black hoppers was the best method for him over the day. Well done Mr Gill on a great day, and lovely to have you with us.

On Wednesday Mick Fisher had a successful day, taking seven rainbows to the boat with his best weighing in at 3lb 8oz. He notes that the fish were high in the water, and used a floating line with montanas, finding success all around the reservoir.

On Thursday Lester Booth and Nigel Nixon landed eight to the boat, fishing in various areas across the reservoir, but finding success using dry flies, the best of which proving to be culls. Excellent work chaps!

Friday saw Scraggy and Duffy have a fantastic day of fishing out on the water, catching a total of ten to the boat including a brown, with their heaviest recorded fish of the day going to Scraggy with a 4lb rainbow. They report that fishing out in the middle of the reservoir using snakes on a sinking line was their method of choice. As always, great to have you with us.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **2.62** with 89 fish caught by 34 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest Rainbow was 4lb caught by Mr Scragg.

Methods & Flies

Fish have been caught using a mixture of sinking and intermediate lines. Fishing on a drift has also proven popular. The most successful flies were black, white or silver snakes, hoppers, montanas, diawl bachs blue flash damsels, boobies and dry flies.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been Fishtail Creek, Millfields, and the main basin.
