

# Fishing Report 23rd May 2022

This week has been all about sinking lines, with most anglers finding success fishing deep and pulling slowly up through the water. Although buzzer use is tailing off a little, we have had reports of a good hatch of lake olives being spotted earlier in the week. Our rod average has dropped a touch, but is still sitting healthily at a very respectable 3.29. With the weather changing from strong winds to warm days with bright sunshine, the drop this week was expected.

On Monday, Carsington regulars Joe Cummins and Richard Savidge had a good day out on the water, catching 16 to the boat with their heaviest rainbows weighing in at 4lbs and 3lbs 8oz respectively. They tell us that the water was catching well all over, and using an orange clink on a fast sink line was most successful. Well done chaps, cracking effort!

On Wednesday Graham Wood made it a hat trick by having a third week of excellent fishing out on the water, again catching 15 to the boat with his heaviest being a 3lb rainbow. He found that snakes were the best fly option for the day. Another great week Mr Wood, well done!

On Saturday Robert Ball and Terry Mallard had a great visit, taking 18 to the boat with their best fishing weighing in at 3lb 4oz. They tell us that Millfields was a great location and fishing buzzers and FAB's worked best for them. Great results for a cracking day on the water.

Saturday also saw Paul Pearce take the crown for both the heaviest rainbow and heaviest brown of the week, his 6lb rainbow can be seen below. He found both Tower Bank and Sitch Plantation fished well, and using Di7 line and snakes were the method and fly of choice.

The Masonic 'St Oswald Plate' competition between St Oswald and Fly Fishers' Lodges took place on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> May. A total of 24 fish were caught by 21 competitors. The competition was won by Fly Fishers' Lodge with a total weight of 32lb - 7oz. Well done to all involved, and we look forward to your return next year.

# **Methods & Flies**

Fish have been caught using mostly sinking lines, with Di7 lines being a line of choice this week. Fishing a drift and using a slow retrieve has also worked well for some.

The most successful flies were snakes, orange clinks, orange blobs, buzzers, nymphs, FAB's shuttlecocks, white boobies and diawl bachs.

## Top Spot

The most popular spots have been Tower Bank, Brown Ale Bay, Sitch Plantation, Fishtail Creek, Millfields, Sailing Club Island and buoys 4 & 7.
