

# Fishing Report 27th September 2021

This week's rod average is 3.7

Great to see an increase in rod average this week, many anglers have caught into double figures on Wednesday and Thursday. The cooler nights are helping to bring down the surface water temperatures and are encouraging the fish closer to the surface. Some anglers have had success on floating lines and dry flies, others are still catching on boobies, snakes and damsels deeper down.

It's due to be a cooler, windy week providing very different fishing conditions from the past weeks.

We have a couple of boats left for the Autumn Open competition which will be held this coming Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> October. Bookings to be made via our website.

For those traveling to us on Saturday there is due to be a local road closure so please check out the diversion route before setting off.

### **Car Parking**

Car parking charges are included with your fishing booking. However your vehicle registration details must be given at the point you check in and collect your catch return.

Please ensure that the correct registration details are logged as a number of our anglers have had a parking charge notice from Group Nexus. These can be appealed if we have proof that your registration number was logged during your visit, however appeals will not be accepted if the wrong details have been given at the point of check in.

#### Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **3.7** with 222 fish caught by 60 anglers.

#### Best Rainbow

The heaviest Rainbow were 5lb caught by Messrs Sims, Atkinson and Jones. The heaviest Brown was 3lb caught by Mr D Cornforth.

## Methods & Flies

Fish have been caught using a mixture of sinking or floating lines, very much depending on the weather, with cloud cover allowing success with dries on floating lines. Drifting and a slow retrieve have been very popular this week.

The most successful flies have been daddies, claret hoppers, boobies, damsels and snakes.

The most popular spots have been out in the main basin, Fishtail Creek and Buoys 5, 6 and 0.



#### **Wheelyboat Fund Raising Project for Carsington Water Fishery**

Tony has already been busy looking at grant applications from all around the local area with donations already being pledged via the Ashbourne Freemasons. The Wheelyboat trust are the principal fundraiser and they have kindly set up a CAF fund raising page to help increase the funding level and meet Tony's target.
