



Fishing Report 28th June 2021

The rod average has popped back up to 3.82 this week which is a good rate for our water at this time of year. The changeable weather last week meant that a mix of techniques were used successfully, from a fast retrieve on floating lines to slow retrieves from around 10 feet down. The south-eastern corner of the reservoir proved most popular, fishing well from Sitch Plantation right down to the dam wall.

We were pleased to welcome the Foremark Fly Fishers for their match with us on Sunday. Six anglers from their club took to the water and bagged 35 fish between them with Ric Saccone taking the heaviest bag at 10lb 2oz for his four fish, and also heaviest fish with a 3lb rainbow. One member caught 10 fish and many said that they had experienced takes all day but not all resulted in a catch.

Thank you to those who have donated via the Wheely Boat Trust link to support the fundraising for a new accessible fishing boat.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **3.82** with 233 fish caught by 61 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest Rainbow were 4lb caught by Messrs Gregg, Armitage and Sims.

The heaviest Brown was 3lb 8oz caught by Mr Buxton.

Methods & Flies

Fish have been caught using floating lines with a fast retrieve or sinking lines on a slow retrieve, this has been very much weather dependant.

The most successful flies were damselfly, pink or green snakes, black and green lures, orange blobs, shrimps and diawl bachs.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been Sitch Plantation, Fishtail Creek, Upperfields Bay, Millfields Bay and the Dam Wall.



Wheelyboat Fund Raising Project for Carsington Water Fishery

Tony Higton, who supports our fishery with many aspects including our popular open competitions, is working closely with the Wheelyboat Trust to raise funds for a 3rd wheelyboat. Over the past year we have seen an increased need for more access boats of this kind. We have many anglers who use this due to a disability, ill health, or temporary conditions whilst recovering from treatment or an operation.

Tony's aim is to raise just over £13,000 for a new coulam wheelyboat, including push start engine and seats. Tony has already been busy looking at grant applications from all around the local area with donations already being pledged via the Ashbourne Freemasons. The Wheelyboat trust are the principal fundraiser and they have kindly set up a CAF fund raising page to help increase the funding level and meet Tony's target.
