

# Fishing Report 30th May 2022

This week we have been lucky to host 4 days of fishing with the England Fly Fishing Association.

Monday was a practice day ahead of the EFFA versa Bowlanders match on Tuesday. 36 anglers fished this match with 56 fish being caught, the largest being 63cm caught by Andy Linwood.

Wednesday saw a smaller group pleasure fishing ahead of the EFFA Annual match, 27 angler took part catching 45 fish overall. The largest fish being 55cm caught by Mick Facey. All matches were fished to strict international rules therefor lots of boats fished a drift on the main basin over deeper water.

Saturday produced excellent conditions with a number of boats catching 5 plus fish there were many reports of lots of fish being seen however being difficult to catch and bring to the net. Brown ale bay, Upperfields and the Dam wall being popular spots.

Unfortunately the rod average has dropped this week, the weather has been very changeable with wind directions changing almost daily. The natural fly life has noticeably reduced causing a change in feeding habits. Lets hope this weeks conditions are more favourable and todays stocking will liven things up.

#### Methods & Flies

Fish have been caught using a mixture of sinking and floating lines. Fishing a drift and using a slow retrieve has also worked well with other fishing a collection of flies on washing line.

The most successful flies were snakes, orange blobs, buzzers, nymphs and olives. A few mayfly have also been seen so may be worth a try.

## **Top Spot**

The most popular spots have been Fishtail Creek, North End, Sheepwash, Millfields and drifting the main basin.
