## Fishing Report 4<sup>th</sup> October 2021

This week's rod average is 2.51.

The wind, rain and cooler temperatures saw a reduced number of boats out this week. Those that fished caught reasonably well some having 7/8 fish to the boat. The main basin and Fishtail Creek have been popular areas with most anglers fishing a fast retrieve on intermediate lines using black and green patterns, snakes and damsels.

Those who fished during Thursday and Friday were chasing tips and tactics for the Autumn Open competition. See below details of the Autumn Open winners, there is more information on our separate Autumn Open report.

### Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **2.51** with 113 fish caught by 45 anglers.

### Best Rainbow

The heaviest Rainbow was 5lb caught by Mr Tempest.

### Methods & Flies

Fish have been caught using intermediate lines, with a Di5 line proving popular. Drifting and using a fast retrieve has been the prevalent method this week.

The most successful flies have been hoppers, orange lures, black or white snakes, orange fritz and black & green damsels.

### Top Spot

The most popular spots have been the North End, Half Moon Bay, Fishtail Creek and Buoys 6, 7 and 11.

### Wheelyboat Fund Raising Project for Carsington Water Fishery

Tony Higton, who supports our fishery with many aspects including our popular open competitions, is working closely with the Wheelyboat Trust to raise funds for a 3rd wheelyboat. Over the past year we have seen an increased need for more access boats of this kind. We have many anglers who use this due to a disability, ill health, or temporary conditions whilst recovering from treatment or an operation.

Tony's aim is to raise just over £13,000 for a new coulam wheelyboat, including push start engine and seats. Tony has already been busy looking at grant applications from all around the local area with donations already being pledged via the Ashbourne Freemasons. The Wheelyboat trust are the principal fundraiser and they have kindly set up a CAF fund raising page to help increase the funding level and meet Tony's target.
