

Fishing Report 9th May 2022

It's been a busy week out on the water, with us hosting some club matches alongside the AT TEFF Heat on Sunday, with many anglers booking in practise boats in the run upto the competition.

The weather has been mostly warm and settled and the fly hatches have continued to rise, with buzzers remaining a firm favourite amongst our anglers. The rod average has risen to 4.65, with the majority of anglers finding success on floating lines.

Monday saw Mr Buckley have a fantastic day out on the water, netting 21 fish to his boat, six of which were browns - great effort!

On Thursday Phil Harding had a great day, landing 9 fish to his boat with one of his rainbows weighing in at a whopping 5lb12oz and taking the title of the week's heaviest rainbow - excellent work!

On Friday one of our long-standing anglers Graham Wood caught 11 to the boat including a brown, with his heaviest rainbows weighing in at 4lb 8oz and 3lbs consecutively - a very successful day on the water, well done!

On Saturday Mark Parsley had a great fish in readiness for Sunday's AT TEFF Heat, catching 18 through the day. Like a lot of the anglers fishing in practise for the heat, he's kept the location, methods and flies used a closely guarded secret! A fantastic day non the less.

On Sunday we played host to the AT-TEFF Loch Style Qualifier. The competition comprised of 26 anglers hoping to qualify for the final in September. Well done to Richard Hood who came first place catching 17 fish overall, his winning bag weight with bonuses was 34lbs 10oz.

All but one angler caught and the rod average for the event was 6.9. The heaviest recorded competition fish caught was 4lb 2oz although a couple of 7lb fish were caught during the competition after bag limits were reached. The feed back regarding quality of our fighting fish and staff support was much appreciated. We hope to see many of you back soon out on the water soon.

The rod average for this week was **4.99** with 479 fish caught by 91 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest Rainbow was 5lb 12oz caught by Phil Harding.

We also have a record of an est. 6lb rainbow caught by lan Colclough.

The heaviest Browns were 4lb caught by Chris Hulme, John Henshall and Mark Mathieson.

Methods & Flies

Fish have been caught using predominantly floating lines, some finding success with a midge tip.

The most successful flies were buzzers, nymphs, black tadpoles, blobs, minkies, crunchers and pink snakes.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been Stones Island, Tower Bank, Brown Ale Bay, Fishtail Creek, and Millfields.
