



Fishing Report - Week ending Sun 20th July 2025

Despite being warned of thunder and lightning Carsington didn't experience any of the forecast weather warnings until much later on Sunday evening. Unfortunately, the weather certainly put off anglers who probably missed an excellent weekends fishing.

The rod average has increased to 5 which just shows that a slight reduction in air temperature has brought the fish back on with many anglers recording higher figure catch rates. We can also report that the water levels have stabilised this last week which will really help the conditions, and the air temperatures have reduced which have helped to keep water temperatures from increasing further.

Tuesday saw our weeks fish delivery from Bibury with some fine specimens finding comfort in their new home and ready for anglers to find.

Wednesday fished well with a mix of regular and visiting anglers. We had a number of high catch returns if was great to see so many fish caught and once again a mix of tactics. Fishing deep or on the surface with dries all found results. Colin Hendry caught his 7 between buoy 7 and Millfields fishing deep during the day and then moving onto the dries during the evening session. Gwyneth Mooney also caught 7 and fish near the Dam on a MIDAS dry.

David Riley caught 8 fish using a Di7 and a snake with number of other anglers using this tactic.

Michael Jacks recorded the highest catch rate of the day with 10 fish using hoppers and black Muddler. His catch right improved as the cloud cover came over, bringing the fish up and showing more interest in the fly.


Thursday continues to fish well, Ian Wood & David Allen catching 26 fish to the boat having great success fishing around buoy 8.

Other successful catches saw fish taking pink snakes, blobs and boobies.

Friday was a little more difficult with records of more perch than trout being caught!

Unfortunately, the weather forecast for the weekend really put people off with just one boat out and a couple of fish caught.

The rod average for this week was 5 with 81 fish caught by 16 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbows caught this week weighed approx. 4lbs 8oz caught by Michael Jacks during our final evening fishing session. This was caught near buoy 10 deep down.
Chris Wilcock also caught a small brownie over around 1lb.

Methods & Flies

Most popular methods have been floating lines, Midge Tips, fast sinking lines or slow sinking lines.
The most popular flies have been muddlers, midas, orange blobs, orange lure, pink snakes and black snakes.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been Millfields, Dam Wall, buoys 7, 8 & 10 also drifting down the middle have proved very popular.
