## Carsington Fishing Report

11<sup>th</sup> August 2014

Despite the changeable weather conditions this week we have seen an increase in the rod average to 2.26. There have been a mixture of successful methods from fishing on the surface with dries or trying a little deeper in the cooler water with lures and boobies.

### Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **2.26** with 52 fish caught by 23 anglers.

### Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow caught this week was 3lbs 4oz by Mr Neale in the middle of the water on a bibio.

### Top Spots

The most successful areas have been North End, Dam Wall, Brown Ale Bay, Millfields and the middle of the reservoir.

### Methods & Flies

The most successful patterns were daddies, bibio, sedges, shipmans buzzer, diawl bachs, claret popper hopper and black hoppers.

Most fish have been caught whilst drifting across deeper areas of the lake and also using dry flies on the surface others have been successful a little deeper in the cooler water fishing on lures and boobies.

### Fly Casting Lessons

We still have a few places left for this coming weekend.

An opportunity to learn the basics of fly fishing, the course covers basic casting, knots and entomology. Our qualified instructor will provide all equipment for the course - you are welcome to bring your own.
