



Fishing Report 11th September 2017

This week has been a little more of a challenge with the ever changing weather conditions. Most fish are still being caught in the main basin of the reservoir. However, some fish have been caught closer to the margins casting towards the weed beds.

Stocking Plan

Many anglers are asking the questions regarding our stocking plan in relation to the diminishing water levels. No changes have been made to our 2017 stocking plan and we are due to take deliveries as usual over the coming weeks.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **3.33** with 203 fish caught by 61 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest Rainbow was 3lbs 10oz caught by James Scade.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been around Tower bank, the main basin, Fish Tail Creek, Buoys 3, 5, 7 & 8, North End and Watersport & Sailing Club Islands.

Methods & Flies

The most successful patterns were Bibio, minkie, snakes, black lures, hoppers and blobs. Most anglers have fished on a drift in the main basin using intermediate or sinking lines using the fast retrieve method.

25 Year Anniversary Tagged Fish Competition

To mark Carsington Water's 25th Anniversary we have launched a tagged fish competition. We have released 25 tagged fish into the reservoir with a number of prizes to be won for those caught throughout the 2017 season. To date 15 of the 25 fish have been caught so lots more prizes up for grabs.

Autumn Open Competition – Now Fully Booked

Carsington is a great venue for Fly fishing competitions and following the success of both our Spring and Autumn competitions we are pleased to announce the date for the 2017 Autumn Open on Sat 7th October 2017. The *Carsington Autumn Open competition* is aimed at all anglers who enjoy a day's boat fishing with a friend. It will be an organised event based on two people per boat with an individual bag limit of 6 fish. Prizes will be awarded for the winning pair with the heaviest collective bag and a number of individual prizes. The cost of entry will be £60.00 per pair including permits and petrol boat hire.
