

Fishing Report 14th September 2015



As we start the second half of September the rod average is creeping up to over 4! Again this week most fish have been caught on the Eastern side of the reservoir. The weed beds are now starting to recede which should enable more fishing along Tower Bank and Sheepwash. A good number of fish were caught on Dries, Daddies, Hoppers and Bibios. Alex Haywood even caught fish using a fly made from hair clippings off his dog! D Naylor had great success on Thursday landing 20 fish to the boat using Hoppers.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was 4.85 with 393 fish caught by 79 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow was 4lb 4oz caught by Mr Attwell The heaviest brown was 3lb 4oz caught my Mr Pinder The heaviest blue was 3lb 8oz caught by Mr Seek

Top Spot

Popular areas this week have been drifting across the main basin, Fishtail Creek, Upperfields Bay and towards the North End.

Methods & Flies

The most successful patterns were minkie, daddies, black or orange blobs, bibios, hoppers cats whisker and dries There has been a real mix of lines used this week including floating, Intermediate, sink tip and fast retrieve.
