We have had a slight drop in rod average to 5.36, this decrease has been mainly effected by the windy conditions. Despite this we have had some great evening fishing conditions seeing lots of fly life, especially sedges.

We have a number of new fly patterns which are working well with the change weather conditions and water temperature they are available to purchase on reception.



Rod Average

The rod average for last week was 5.36 with 482 fish caught by 90 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow weighed 3lb 12oz caught by C Fraser on a Hares Ear using a intermediate line.

We had many browns caught this week but unfortunately none of the weight were recorded on the returns.

Top Spots

The top spots this week have been Brown Ale bay, North end, fishtail creek, Upperfields Bay, Millfields & Sailing club island and Watersports island.

Method & Flies

The most popular fly patterns used this week have bumble claret, black tadpole, black buzzers other popular patterns were daddies, daiwl bach, hares ear, bibio and hot head damsel. Mostly floating and intermediate lines have been used this week.
