Carsington Fishery Report 1st September 2013

Although the rod average is still low it looks like we are having a change in method with more fish being caught on intermediate and floating lines. It's been great to see more natural fly life enticing the fish out from the weed beds and on to the surface. More fish have been caught on dry patterns and many on daddies.



Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **2.13** with 151 fish caught by 71 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow this week was 3 ½ lbs caught by Mr N Neale in the middle on a floating line. The heaviest brown was 3lbs 8oz was caught by Mr M Rawson.

Top Spots

The most successful areas have been in the deeper sections of Stitch Plantation, Fishtail creek, Millfields, North End and drifting from the east side towards the middle of the reservoir around buoys 4,5 & 6.

Method & Flies

The most successful patterns are Montana, cats whiskers, red booby, daddies, minnow and hot head damsel. A whole mixture of methods have been used with some fish still being caught on sinking lines in deeper water and other showing on the surface taking on floating lines with dry flies.
