

Fishing Report 20th July 2015



A slight increase in the rod average this week, helped by a fine day on Wednesday which produced some good returns.

The weed banks are now starting to appear on the margins, and the water levels have reduced a little, this means tactics might have to change over the coming weeks as the fish move out into the deeper water.

3 nice fish caught by Mr Paterson on Friday, the largest 2lbs 8oz.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **3.08** with 151 fish caught by 49 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow was 3lbs 12oz caught by Mr Matthews on a daddy at Brown Ale point.

There were no browns recorded this week but a few blues were caught.

Top Spot

Popular areas this week have been brown ale bay, Upperfields bay, Watersports Island, Sailing Club Island and Millfields. Anglers are moving out into the deeper water as the water temperatures rise.

Methods & Flies

The most successful patterns were small Black Buzzers, Hot Head Damsel, Cruncher, Damsel Nymph, Diawl Bach, Gold Head Montana, Bibio, Claret Hoppers, Black Spider, Ace of Spades, Cats whisker and Dries Most anglers have used intermediate and floating lines.
