

Fishing Report 23rd March 2015



The excellent fishing has continued throughout our first full week of the 2015 season producing a rod average of 10.72. This is more than double the rod average at this time last season so fingers crossed it continues!

We have had a mix of conditions throughout the week leading to lots of different methods being used. It has been interesting to see that some anglers have seen success on buzzers and dry flies this early in the season.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was 10.72 with 579 fish caught by 54 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow caught this week was 7lbs 6oz by Mr C Critchley. No Browns were recorded this week.

Top Spots

The most successful areas have been all along the east side of the reservoir and towards the north end. Fishtail Creek, Tower Bank and Brown Ale Bay have also been popular.

Methods & Flies

The most successful patterns were montana, booby, minkie, black and green lures, cats whisker and buzzers. Most anglers have used sinking lines on a fast retrieve.
