The heaviest Rainbow was 5lbs caught by Mr Massey Although several browns and blues were caught there were no recorded weights!

The most popular spots have been Brown Ale Bay, Sheepwash and the Eastern Banks

The most successful patterns were Green and Black, Viva, Buzzers, Boobies and Pink Snakes. Sinking and Intermediate lines have been used.
