

Fishing Report 28th September 2015



One of many misty mornings this week

Some blustery conditions early on in the week made fishing difficult for some, resulting in a lower rod average for this week. On Wednesday Mr Margett and Mr Harding caught 13 blues!

All manor of lines have been used this week but slow sink lines seem to have produced the best results.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was 2.57 with 131 fish caught by 51 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow was 4lb caught by Mr Rawson The heaviest brown was 2lb 4oz caught my Mr Parker The heaviest blue was 3lb 12oz caught by Mr Harding

Top Spot

Popular areas this week have been drifting across the main basin, Fishtail Creek and Buoys 4, 5, 6 and Tower Bank

Methods & Flies

The most successful patterns were blobs, Hot Head Damsels, Minkies, Hoppers and Montanas There has been a real mix of lines used this week including slow sink, Intermediate and Floating
