Carsington Fishery Report 29th July 2013

It's been another hard week of August fishing with a rod average of just under 2. We have had interesting fishing conditions battling between bright sunshine and heavy, thundery rain! Fish have been mostly caught in deeper water areas where the water temperatures are cooler. Most anglers have been using sinking lines with colorful fly patterns, for example orange boobies or fritz patterns.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **1.72** with 103 fish caught by 60 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow this week was 4lbs 10oz caught by Phil Harding near Stitch plantation. No browns were recorded this week

Top Spots

The most successful areas have been in the deeper sections of Stitch Plantation, Fishtail creek, Millfields, North End and drifting from the back of the Sailing Club and Watersports islands.

Method & Flies

The most successful patterns are cats whiskers, coral & orange booby, green & black fritz, minnow and hot head damsel.

Sinking lines have been a must this week. The fish are most certainly deep in the cooler water. Bright and sparkly fly patterns are also helping to entice the fish out of the weed beds.

Boats can leave the jetty from 8.30am All boats are back to the jetty by 9.00pm Please allow a few minutes to return from your fishing spot Please note that Carsington is a boat fishing water only.
