

Fishing Report 6<sup>th</sup> July 2015



Varying weather conditions this week have resulted on varying amounts of fish caught by anglers each day.

Warmer water temperatures and the onset of weed growth on the margins have helped to reduce the rod average with the fish becoming more elusive.

## Rod Average

The rod average for this week was 3.42 with 270 fish caught by 79 anglers.

#### Best Rainbow/Brown

We had two 4lb rainbows caught this week by Mr Fraser and Mr Franklin The heaviest Brown was 2lbs 14oz caught by Mr P Pearce.

## **Top Spot**

Popular areas this week have been Tower Bank, Fishtail creek, Upperfields bay, Watersports Island, Dam wall and Millfields. Anglers are moving out into the deeper water as the water temperatures rise.

## **Methods & Flies**

The most successful patterns were small Black Buzzers, Hot Head Damsel, Cruncher, Damsel Nymph, Diawl Bach, Gold Head Montana, Bibio, Claret Hoppers, Black Spider, Ace of Spades, Cats whisker and Dries Most anglers have used intermediate and floating lines.
