9th June 2014

The rod average has taken an unfortunate slip this week due to the poor weather conditions at the beginning of the week. Those fishing over the weekend had more successful trips with many anglers catching fish into double figures.

It's been great to hear that some fish have been caught on dry flies now that the air and water temperature has increased a little.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **4.79** with 417 fish caught by 87 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow this week was 4lbs 12oz caught by Mr McLelle.

The heaviest brown caught was 2lbs 6oz caught by Mr Rippon on a black black buzzer.

A number of blues were caught but weights were not recorded.

Top Spots

The most successful areas have been stones island, sailing club island, Half moon, Tower bank, Millfields, Upperfields Bay and Fishtail creek.

Methods & Flies

The most successful patterns are bibio, black spider, hopper, hares ear, nymphs, daddies, hares ear, cruncher, cats whisker, hot head damsels, black buzzers, zonkers and diawl bachs.

Most fish have been caught on floating and intermediate lines, close to the margins.

Tagged Fish

The tagged fish is still out there to be caught. Don't forget if you catch it to take a photo of the tag or write down the code.

Please help us out

To help us keep the boats clean and tidy we would be very grateful if you could wash off the anchors before returning them into the boats.

Also for those who are smoking in the boats please do not extinguish your cigarette on the boat itself.
