
Carsington Fishery Report 9th September 2013

It looks like the rod average is on the up!

Some great fish have been caught on intermediate and floating lines, daddies and hoppers have worked very well showing catch results for some anglers of 10 or more fish each.

We thought you might like to see a comparison of rod averages over the last 2 seasons, see below.

Hopefully with water levels staying reasonably high, regular stocking and so much natural food, the next few months should result in some great fishing.



Rod Average

The rod average for this week was **3.82** with 130 fish caught by 34 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow this week was 4 lbs caught by Mr S Leak on a sinking line. The heaviest brown was 1lbs 8oz was caught by Mr P Pearce.

Top Spots

The most successful areas have been in the deeper sections of North End, Halfmoon Field, Fishtail Creek and the Dam Wall.

Method & Flies

The most successful patterns are Montana, bibio, orange blobs, daddies, gold head hares ear, and hoppers. More fish have been caught on intermediate and floating lines, its been great to see reports of fish being caught on the surface especially on daddies.

Boats can leave the jetty from 8.30am All boats are back to the jetty by 7.30pm Please allow a few minutes to return from your fishing spot Please note that Carsington is a boat fishing water only. It is advisable that boat bookings are made in advance to avoid disappointment. Discounts are available for bookings of 5 or more boats.
