

Fishing Report - Week ending Sun 20th April 2025

It was a slow start to the week with cooler temperatures and gusty conditions. Despite the conditions Steve Marples caught a cracking 15 fish using cats whiskers.

As things settled from Wednesday onwards the buzzers fishing certainly kicked in and many fish were caught producing a slight increase in the rod average to 6.45.

Thursday saw many boats out and a number of fish caught, Roy Lewin returned following his visit on Sunday for the Alex Booth competition and had a much better day with 14 fish to the boat. All were caught on buzzers around Half Moon Bay using the figure of 8 fishing method.

This success continued into Friday with Rod Goldthorpe also fishing buzzer in the same area on the Eastern shore and having 24 fish to the boat. Mr Livin and Mr Evans also fished the same bank and caught 10 -12 fish - most fish being between 2 – 3lbs. Interestingly, many of these were caught on very different methods with black & green lures and sinking lines.

The overcast conditions of Saturday produced excellent fishing conditions and saw many anglers recording double figures. A number of boats were out practicing ahead of next week's Spring Open Competition. The last few boats have now been taken for this competition so fingers crossed for good weather conditions and hopefully, the water will continue to fish well.

On Sunday we played host to the All Abilities Friendly Fly Fishers (AAFFF)

This is a fantastic group who support and promote fishing to beginner and experience anglers with a variety of disabilities. We had 8 boats out in total. All anglers caught with one boat having 35 fish on total. See report and pictures kindly sent in by organisers Mark Goodge.

The rod average for the opening weekend was 6.45 with 413 fish caught by 64 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbow was caught by Mark Smith at 4lbs 8oz

Methods & Flies

Anglers have mostly used a mixture of floating and sinking lines lines, Di3, Di5 & Di8 and sink tips with a slow retrieve also some found the figure of 8 method successful.

The most popular fly patterns have been buzzers, nymphs, dawlbach, hot head damsels, black & green Montana, gold head hares ear, cats whisker, pink snakes, black and green lures.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been, fishtail creek, Upperfields Bay, Halfmoon bay, Stitch Plantation and Millfields.
