



Fishing Report - Week ending Sun 22nd June 2025

With the hottest week of the year so far this has certainly affected the fishing conditions.

Monday was one of our busiest days ahead of the increasing temperatures. Colin Hendry caught an impressive 11 fish in Fishtail Creek, he had a great day fishing dry flies and the fish really came on during the late afternoon. Other anglers had success on hoppers and buzzers across the East Bank.

Tuesday was warm and windy and a mixture of methods were used. Some anglers successfully caught on dries whilst others changed to fast or slow sinking lines with a mixture of buzzers, blobs and lures.

Wednesday was especially warm and still making fishing conditions very hard. Unfortunately catch results were quite low. John Bond did catch his 4 fish, he fished the middle of the water, using slow sinking line with an orange lure.

Thursday was very similar with most boats drifting down the middle of the water. Friday's forecast and prolonged warm weather put paid to fishing with no boats booked.

The weekend has been quite different with Saturday being still and warm and Sunday very breezy. With just a couple of boats out and a few fish caught.

Our water levels are starting to drop because of the warm weather. The margins are very weedy so please be mindful of how this affects driving conditions. If you find yourself with lots of weed around your propeller then pop the engine in reverse for a short amount of time at low speed and the weed will clear.

The week ahead looks like it is due to start off quite breezy with conditions becoming more favourable as the days proceed. Air temperatures are averaging 20 which should make being out on the water much more pleasant. Don't forget we have a late night until 8pm on Wednesday.

Evening Fishing

Thanks to all those who have supported the evening fishing so far this season. We have more dates coming up through May and June and hopefully will be able to add a few in for early July before the water temperatures become warmer.

If you wish to fish into the evening until 8pm please make sure you book the later fishing time option or let us know at point of booking. We do not charge any extra for the boats on these days.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was 2.4 with 67 fish caught by 28 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbows caught this week weighed approx 3lbs 8oz caught by John Bond.

Methods & Flies

Most popular methods have been floating lines, Midge Tips and sinking lines. Many anglers have fished and washing line of flies especially buzzers and nymphs.

The most popular flies have been black or olive buzzer, grey wulff, high planes drifter, nymphs, daiwl bach's, red, brown and orange hoppers, rusty midas, orange blobs, hot head damselfs, mini lures, fritz lure and pink snakes.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been on the east bank especially fishtail creek, half moon field and Millfields, also drifting down the middle have proved very popular.
