



Fishing Report - Week ending Sun 27th July 2025

We have seen a slight drop in rod average even though weather conditions have been more favourable for fishing with a number of overcast days.

The week started out with a significant amount of much needed rain which helped maintain levels.

Mr Bond and his boat partner battled on through the conditions catching 8 fish to the boat. They fished deep around the Dam wall and out into the deeper water. Snakes and daiwl bachs working well.

Tuesday saw a little improvement in the weather and Mr Cummins and Mr Savage ventured out also fishing the middle of the water, catching their fish deep down.

Wednesday through to Friday gave us warm, brighter conditions. Ian Ritchie brought 11 fish to the boat and recorded seeing lots of fish on every drift and many takes which didn't quite end in full catches. He fished around buoy 4 and into Fishtail Creek using a Di3 and black snake.

Friday was an excellent day with a mixture of pink or black snakes, orange boobies, blacks lures and daddies proving great success. The best area still being middle of the water, drifting the deeper section.

Saturday was a mixed day; it started off with some drizzle and finished warm. The catch returns were also very varied, most catching 2 & 3, some struggling and others like Mr Hendry bring 6 to the boat. He fished Bouy 7 & 10 using a Di3 on a fast retrieve just sub surface - Claret Midas during the morning and changing to a pink snake in the afternoon.

Fish are still fighting hard and in excellent condition.

Sunday was another busy day for the end of July although the rain didn't materialise the weather stayed overcast and a little blustery. Despite looking like the perfect fishing day, the returns were a little lower than expected. Anglers did record that many fish were seen, they had multiple takes, but full catches were tricky.

It's a must to book ahead so we can make sure we have a boat for you and its set up ready to go prior to your arrival. Due to the lower water levels we have reduced the number of boats on our jetty so please book online or call ahead to check availability.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was 3.6 with 83 fish caught by 23 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

The heaviest rainbows caught this week weighed approx. 45lbs caught by Simon Alway.

Methods & Flies

Most popular methods have been mostly sinking lines, Midge Tips, fast sinking lines or slow sinking lines.

The most popular flies have been claret midas, orange blobs, orange or black lure, pink snakes, black snakes, daddies, daiwl bach.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been Fishtail creek, Millfields, Dam Wall, buoys 5, 7 & 10 also drifting down the middle have proved very popular.
