



## Fishing Report - Week ending Sun 29<sup>th</sup> June 2025

A challenging windy and warm week has resulted in a rod average of 2.6 which is slightly higher than the previous week despite the conditions.

Unfortunately, the strong winds put paid to several days of fishing this week with strong south westerly winds producing conditions with very little shelter.

Wednesday brought a lull in these extreme conditions and a number of our regular anglers fished with some good results. A few boats even took advantage of the evening fishing and stayed out a little later. Mr Wood and Mr McParlane caught 5 – 7 fish. Both fished a drift down the centre of the water with sinking lines and snakes.

Thursday & Friday hosted a few anglers, but conditions were either too windy or too hot making the days very challenging with only a few fish caught by most anglers. A mixture of fishing deep and on the surface produced catches.

Saturday was again breezy with a few boats out and fishing the deeper sections. Conditions providing a swift, drift up the middle of the water. With the North end and areas around Stitch Plantation producing some good catches. Ian Ritchie reported having a

‘Surprisingly good day!’

Reporting 8 fish caught using an orange blob booby on a DI3. His best fish being 3lbs 8ozs. He mainly fished a drift from Buoy 10 the Stitch Plantation.

Sunday was much calmer with rising temperatures, especially in the afternoon. Once again, a mix of techniques were used producing catches. Some opted for DI3 with snakes and other went for floating lines with buzzers, damsels or daddies.

We are still looking at a hot week ahead with variable wind strengths.

We have a busy day on Wednesday with several boats involved in a floating line competition.

There isn't any option for evening fishing this week, but it will be back for a few more weeks following.

### **Evening Fishing**

Thanks to all those who have supported the evening fishing so far this season. We have more dates coming up through July before the water temperatures become too warm.

### Methods & Flies

Most popular methods have been floating lines, Midge Tips and slow sinking lines.

The most popular flies have been black or olive buzzer, daddies, sedges, daddies, damsels, orange blobs, snakes, orange boobies.

### Top Spot

The most popular spots have been Millfields, Fishtail Creek, Stitch Plantation also drifting down the middle have proved very popular.
