



## Fishing Report - Week ending Sun 6<sup>th</sup> July 2025

It has been yet another week of warm, windy conditions with a rod average of 2.24. This being similar to the past few weeks.

The beginning of the week brought a number of anglers fishing ahead of the Regional Police Floating Line match on Wednesday.

Monday was one of our calmer days and the hot, still conditions certainly pushed the fish down giving few results especially on floating line methods. A few fish were caught on slow sinking lines with snakes.

Tuesday was a little breezier seeing better success drifting down the middle of the water and a number of anglers catching on floating lines with dry flies. Sedges, daddies, soldier palmer and buzzers appeared to be working well.

Wednesday was a busy day with competition anglers and regular anglers. The wind did increase through the day making conditions more challenging however, most anglers caught with some recording 5 plus fish to the boat. Most fished the middle of the water with some choosing locations off the Dam wall and around Buoy 4.

### Floating Line Competition round up.

Thursday continued to be busy, and catches were mixed with some anglers struggling against the high temperatures and the winds and others catching 5 plus fish with a mixture of techniques; floating lines with buzzers, cormorants, shipman's ginger midge and hoppers; Intermediate lines with snakes or orange lures; Sinking lines, stripped quickly back with pink snakes, black tadpoles. The main areas were middle of the water plus buoys 10 & 5.

It's been a quiet weekend with just a few boats mainly fishing lures around Tower bank and the bank of the islands to shelter from the breeze.

It looks like another warm week ahead; we have later fishing available on Wednesday and our last late fishing session the following week. Please book in so we know that staff are required to facilitate these evening sessions.

### **Evening Fishing**

Thanks to all those who have supported the evening fishing so far this season. We have more dates coming up through July before the water temperatures become too warm.

Dates are Wednesday 9th July, 16th July & 23rd July

If you wish to fish into the evening until 8pm please make sure you book the later fishing time option or let us know at point of booking. We do not charge any extra for the boats on these days.

Most popular methods have been floating lines, Midge Tips, intermediate and fast sinking lines. The most popular flies have been buzzer, daddies, sedges, soldiers palmer, cormorants, shipman's buzzer, orange lures and pink snakes.

### Top Spot

The most popular spots have been Millfields, Fishtail Creek, Stitch Plantation also drifting down the middle have proved very popular.
